



LIBRARY CARD AGREEMENT

Library Card Eligibility

St. Mary Parish Library cards are free to applicants of any age with provision of current physical address and proof of identity. They must meet any of the following criteria:

- Anyone living in or owning property in the library taxing district of St. Mary Parish.
- Residents of library districts that have reciprocal borrowing agreements with St. Mary Parish Library (Acadia Parish Library, Iberia Parish Library, Lafayette Public Library, Opelousas-Eunice Public, St. Martin Parish Library, and Vermilion Parish Library).

Non-Residents are required to purchase a library card. The non-resident fee is \$35 per year for an individual or \$50 per year per family household.

- If you choose to purchase the household option, each household member receives their own library card.
- Residents not living or owning property in the library taxing district of St. Mary Parish and not covered by a reciprocal agreement are required to purchase a Non-Resident card.
- Cash or check payments only.

To get a library card, bring a photo ID & proof of current address to any library branch. (Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.)

Reciprocal Borrowing

Reciprocal borrowing between library systems allows residents of one library district to use the services of another library district. Requirements include proof of residence and a valid library card from your home parish.

- Lafayette Public Library
- Opelousas-Eunice Public
- St. Martin Parish Library
- Vermilion Parish Library
