





Libby is an innovative in-browser and mobile app from OverDrive designed to make borrowing and enjoying e-books, magazines, streaming services and audiobooks from the library easier than ever. Borrow best-sellers and read anytime, anywhere.

Goodbye Overdrive, Hello Libby

Have you been using OverDrive to get eBooks and audio books for a long time? Well, there is a change coming, and it's name is Libby.

OverDrive, the company that provides eBooks and audiobooks to St. Mary Parish Library, will retire the Overdrive app by the end of 2022, and is encouraging current users to switch to Libby, the official replacement for the OverDrive app.

Here's what Libby has to offer:

- Read across devices: All your loans, notes, bookmarks, and reading progress sync across your devices.
- Offline access: Download eBooks and audiobooks for offline reading, or stream them to save space.
- Listen in your car: Enjoy audiobooks in your car through Apple CarPlay, Android Auto, or a Bluetooth connection.
- Send to Kindle: If you prefer reading on your Kindle, Libby can send your library books to it.
- Browse, search, and discover: Explore the collection through catalog guides, subjects, featured titles, and curated lists.
- A state-of-the-art reading experience: Libby's eBook reader makes it easy to customize how you read.
- An intuitive and beautiful audiobook player: Libby makes it simple to listen when, where, and how you want.


